2. This license is granted upon the statements and representations made in the Application, or otherwise filed with or made to the Treasury Department as a supplement to the Application, and is subject to the conditions, among others, that you comply in all respects with all regulations, rulings, orders and instructions issued by the Secretary of the Treasury under the authority cited above and the terms of this license.

3. The Licensee shall furnish and make available for inspection any relevant information, records or reports requested by the Secretary of the Treasury or any duly authorized officer or agency designated by the Secretary.

4. This license expires on **June 15, 2017**, is not transferable, and is subject to the provisions of 31 CFR Parts 501 and 515, and any regulations and rulings issued pursuant thereto. This license may be revoked or modified at any time at the discretion of the Secretary of the Treasury acting directly or through the agency through which the license was issued, or any other agency designated by the Secretary of the Treasury. Willful misrepresentation by you or your agent to secure this license is grounds for declaring it void from the date of its issuance, or from any other date, and may constitute a violation of law.

5. This license does not excuse compliance with any law or regulation administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control (“OFAC”) or another agency (including reporting requirements) applicable to the transactions(s) herein licensed, nor does it release the Licensee or third parties from civil or criminal liability for violation of any law or regulation.

and 31 CFR 515.701 et seq. for provisions relating to penalties.]

SECTION 1 – AUTHORIZATION: a) Licensee is hereby authorized to engage in all transactions necessary to operate air ambulance flights between the United States and Cuba for the limited purpose of carrying out the medical evacuation from Cuba to the United States of persons who are suffering from a life-threatening injury, trauma, or medical condition.

b) This license is valid for multiple round trips, as necessary.

Authority: 31 C.F.R §§ 515.572.

SECTION 2 – RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS: The Licensee shall keep a record of the following information concerning each flight conducted pursuant to Section 1 above:

- (a) the date of the flight;
- (b) the patient’s name, address, and citizenship;
- (c) the reason for the medical evacuation (e.g., accident, stroke, heart attack, or other medical condition);
- (d) the name, company/organization (where applicable), address and telephone number of the individual who requested the medical evacuation; and,
- (e) the name, address, and telephone number of persons (if any) other than employees or agents of the Licensee accompanying the patient aboard the medical evacuation flight in Cuba.

Such records shall be made available for examination upon demand for at least five (5) years from the date of each transaction.

SECTION 3 – WARNING: (a) Except as explicitly set forth in Section 1 above, this license does not authorize any transaction by any person subject to U.S. jurisdiction that is otherwise prohibited by the Cuban Assets Control Regulations.

(b) This license does not excuse the Licensee from compliance with the requirements of any other agencies of the U.S. Government, including but not necessarily limited to the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Industry and Security, and U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Bureau of Customs and Border Protection.
